
Background

2013:

BI Library – 32 business librarians – all generalists No designated subject librarian in Finance

- Growing number of students in finance (now 900)
- Both undergraduate, graduate & PhD's
- The Department of Finance is ranked 10th in Europe, and 2nd in the Nordic countries, based on top-finance publications 2013-2017.
- The Library hosts an extensive collection of databases in Finance
- The Dept saw the need to strengthen Library competence
- The students only had once a week guidance by a fellow student Msc assistant

Types of questions

- 1. I want Chinese Joint ventures with U.S or western Partners. also the structure of the joint venture all list of partners. (if possible, vertical and horizontal structure, meaning downstream or upstream, if not it doesn't matter), the respective names, share, and other financial information if possible.
- 2.We have an excel file with 620 companies that have visited the S&P 500 during the period: 01.01.2014 31.12.2018.We will build a modified Fama and French five-factor model. Thus, the following numbers are needed for each company
 - l. weekly total stock returns
 - 2. SML, HML, MRP, RMW and CMA

Building competence

- Sat inn on classes in a Msc course in Financial Decision Making
- Extensive self study, tutorials, libguides, podcasts etc.
- Two months as a visiting librarian at the Georgetown University, Lauinger Library, Washington DC
- Visit with a business librarian at Library West,
 University of Florida, Gainesville
- Back home shadowing & learning from the Msc student assistant
- Developed a Libguide in Financial Research

Visiting librarian tips:

- Go on the right time visit when the semester is still busy
- Join in on all arrangements going on
- Be bold book time with different people
- Make a list of questions you'd like to discuss
- Visit more than one place, to get a broader perspective

Tips for success

- Have your management's backing on this venture
- Get to know the concepts in finance!
- Hire a student assistant that is willing to share knowledge
 & has interest in the field
- Spend time shadowing the student assistant, when she gives support
- Spend some time abroad!
- Place the designated PC's within range of the front desk –
 both for Bloomberg & Eikon/Datastream!
- Build up a registry of database knowhow to draw on
- Keep a registry of the requests & answers, to track the solutions
- Sign up for the BUSLIB.list, relevant Libguides etc.
- Develop a Libguide, to market the service


